





Parents, vaccines you should know about...

The National Advisory Committee on Immunizations (NACI) recommends vaccines for children to protect against harmful vaccine-preventable diseases. All BC children are offered vaccine protection against many diseases. If your child is missing any of the free vaccines listed below, you can get them by booking an appointment today.

Ask your doctor, public health nurse, or nurse practitioner, about your child's needs for the following vaccines:
